The Vermont Community Development Program (VCDP) is joining the National Community Development Association (NCDCA) to celebrate National Community Development Week from April 2-6, 2018. This is an annual celebration of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and the HOME Investment Partnerships program.

VCDP is celebrating National Community Development Week and the 50th Anniversary of the Fair Housing Act. In Vermont, the availability and supply of safe, decent, affordable housing is the number one impediment to Fair Housing. Over the last seven years, VCDP has awarded over \$40.5 million in grants to 93 different affordable housing projects throughout the state, and leveraged over \$333 million dollars in other resources. CDBG funding has supported planning and feasibility studies, rehabilitation and new construction of single family homes and multi-family rental projects throughout the state.

This effort has created or preserved 2,261 units of affordable housing and has contributed greatly to address the affordable housing crisis.
