


OVERVIEW

The HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) is the nation's largest federal resource for affordable housing development. Administered on behalf of Nebraska by the Department of Economic Development (DED), HOME investments support activities related to the construction, rehabilitation, purchase and financing of affordable housing across the state. The program directly benefits Nebraska's low-income individuals and families, and their communities.

The federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) administers HOME formula grants to states and local jurisdictions. DED administers HOME funds to eligible recipients in Nebraska's non-entitlement communities. Nonprofit housing organizations, public housing authorities and community housing development organizations are eligible HOME recipients.
