

Unsheltered Homelessness – the Data


- Unsheltered homelessness was steadily going down from 2011 to 2015
- It has risen from 2015 to 2020 by 35%
- The rise has been concentrated in homeless individuals (without children)
- Unsheltered homelessness is now higher than 2010 (233,534 vs 233,832)




Rural Homelessness – the Data

Unsheltered Across Geography Types: 2022 PIT Count

 Roughly 20% of people who experience unsheltered homelessness are in rural CoCs





• Over 41% of people experiencing homelessness in rural areas are unsheltered. This is similar to the % that are in urban areas.

Special NOFO

- Reason for the Special NOFO: to provide targeted solutions to address unsheltered homelessness with a set aside for rural areas
- Core focus and competitive aspect: the plan. CoCs were required to set a plan for how they would use these resources in coordination with other partners to address the unsheltered needs
- Round 1 award: Roughly \$315 million announced with over \$54 million in rural areas
- Round 2 award: TBD

What's Unique for Rural Areas

Projects requesting funding under the Rural Set Aside may also apply for the following eligible costs as part of their project:

- Up to 6 months of rent or utility arrears after 2 months of nonpayment of rent or utilities;
- Short-term emergency lodging in motels or shelters, either directly or through vouchers;
- Repairs, up to \$10,000 per structure, that are necessary to make housing habitable to be used for transitional or permanent housing;
- Emergency food and clothing assistance;
- Costs associated with making use of Federal Inventory property programs to house individuals and families experiencing homelessness; and
- Capacity building activities.
