#### **HOME Reform Initiative**

- HOME Rulemaking White House Housing Supply Action Plan
  - OAHP conducted comprehensive review of statute and regulations to identify flexibilities or simplifications
- HUD previously identified these topics in OMB Semi-Annual Agendas
  - CHDOs
  - Community Land Trusts
  - HOME Rents
  - Property Standards
  - Publication expected late this year





## **Upcoming HOME and HTF Guidance**

- HTF Risk Analysis
  - HTF added to CPD Notice on Grantee Risk Analysis for FY 2024
  - Publication is imminent
- HTF Monitoring Exhibits
  - Expected to be issued by end of 2023
  - Compliance monitoring of State HTF grantees to begin in FY 2024
- HOME and HTF (NSPIRE) Property Standards Federal Register Notice
  - Establishing specific deficiencies for written rehabilitation standards and ongoing property inspection protocols





#### **GAO Evaluation of HTF**

- GAO conducted a two-year evaluation of Housing Trust Fund
  - Made 5 recommendations
- Finding: Many Grantees are not including requirement for an independent cost certification by a CPA in written agreements for HTF projects AND are not obtaining cost certifications for completed projects.
- Finding: Many Grantees are not accurately reporting the total number of units in an HTF project (v. HTF-assisted)
- Finding: Many Grantees are not entering project completion information in IDIS within 120 days of final draw





## **HOME Homebuyer Policies Training**

- HOME Homebuyer Program Policies and Procedures training series
- 5-week series targeted to HOME PJs providing homeownership assistance
- Ensures PJs understand key regulatory requirements related to designing HOME homebuyer assistance programs
- Includes required reading, live webinar sessions, prerecorded training content, peer-to-peer discussion forums, case studies, and other exercises
- 2 cohorts completed in 2022; 2 more underway
- Next Up: Pittsburgh in October
- Registration is announced through your Field Office





#### **HOME-ARP Program Status**

- As of August 28th -
  - 600 of 643 HOME-ARP plans have been accepted
  - 224 activities have been funded in IDIS
- Based on approved plans, PJ planned use of funds is:
  - Rental 62%
    TBRA 5%
  - TBRA 5%
  - Supportive Services 16%
  - Noncongregate Shelter 17%





# **Upcoming HOME-ARP TA**

- Implementation Clinics
  - Virtual Clinics 20 deliveries covering substantial amendments, preferences, QPs, policies and procedures
    - Will include activity-specific clinics
    - Expected to begin in October
  - Up to 43 in-person clinics focusing on specific activities and policies and procedures
    - At least one delivery in each HUD region addressing each of the 4
       activities
    - Expected to begin in March
  - Written products and tools under development for use in clinics

#### **Expiring FY 2015 HOME Funds**

- Expiration of 2015 HOME funds: September 27, 2023
- HUD has no authority to suspend or extend the deadline
  - Even in major disaster areas
  - Even if the funds are committed to a HOME project
- All unexpended funds will be recaptured by U.S. Treasury





## **Expiring FY 2015 HOME Funds**

- As of September 11<sup>th</sup>:
  - 134 PJs have uncommitted/undisbursed 2015 HOME funds
    - Under 31 field offices
    - 3 State PJs (i.e., Georgia, Mississippi, Ohio)
    - 131 Local PJs
  - Balance to disburse of \$9,977,455
    - Of which \$5,189,516 remains uncommitted to projects
- In 2021, only \$998K of FY 2014 funds were lost
- Never lost more than ½% of appropriated amount
- Currently about 1.1% of FY 2015 appropriation remains unspent



### **Assistance with Expiring HOME Funds**

- HOME Expiring Funds Report
  - HUD Exchange posted monthly / weekly
  - IDIS PR44 Report can be run at any time for updated info
- HOME FACTS volume 11, number 1 (April 2023)
- HOME expiring funds webinar for PJs (May 24, 2023)
  - Special invitation to PJs w/expiring funds on the report
- One-on-one help for PJs
  - Move expiring funds to projects spending more quickly
  - Move funds out of the CHDO set-aside
  - To date, only a handful of PJs have requested assistance



#### **HTF Commitment & Expenditure Deadlines**

- HTF has a statutory 2-year commitment deadline and regulatory 5-year expenditure deadline
  - Commitment requirement cannot be waived even for disaster
  - Expenditure deadline has been waived a few times for good cause
- 21 States have commitment and/or expenditure deadlines before 12/31/2023
  - \$31.6 million in current shortfalls
- OAHP notifies grantee 120 days and 30 days before deadlines
- OAHP Management reaching out to CPD Field Office Directors about grantees with upcoming deadlines and shortfalls
  - DAS Office interested to know if grantees will meet deadlines
- HTF Deadline compliance Status Report posted monthly to HUD Exchange
- IDIS PR108 Report can be run at any time for updated info
