# **Streamlining Your CDBG Grant Process**



### WHERE WE CAME FROM

- The Wisconsin Department of Administration began to administer the CDBG program in 2011
- The program had been administered by two different state agencies in the preceding two years
- We continued using established programs and methods of distribution
- Had Robert Peterson join our HUD Field Office for a monitoring

### UNDERSTANDING THE ISSUES

- As we started to learn more our supervisors shared the CDBG expenditure naughty list
- At our lowest, Wisconsin was the 4<sup>th</sup> slowest spending State on the list
- We did a deep dive into our program policies to determine the cause and find solutions

### THE ISSUES

- 1) Capacity
- 2) Program income
- 3) Method of distribution
- 4) Shovel ready projects

# CAPACITY

- Doing too much with too little
- Revolving loan funds required too much staff time
- Finding ways to be more efficient
  - Beefing up manuals/program policy info
  - Recording trainings and posting online
  - Centralized fiscal and contracting

# **PROGRAM INCOME**

- Generating millions of program income dollars per year
- PI returned to the State at random, causing lots of busy work
- Made the decision to close our Economic Development RLF
  - Over 125 UGLGs held ED RLF funds
  - State recaptured over \$100 Million in cash on hand
  - Let the UGLGs that returned the funds apply for any eligible CDBG project to utilize funds

### METHOD OF DISTRIBUTION

- PF program was largest CDBG allocation but only made awards annually
- PI received after annual PF awards was causing us not to expend our annual allocation
- Increased max PF award from \$500k to \$1 million
- More aggressive in award amounts

# WHERE WE ARE

- From 4<sup>th</sup> slowest spender to 4<sup>th</sup> fastest. Consistently in top ten
- Understand our capacity and look for efficiency improvements on current program
- Create policies to prevent PI
- May increase max award amounts again
