"Nevada Cares Campus was opened May 2021 and provides emergency shelter and wrap-around services to help the region's most vulnerable residents. The Nevada Cares Campus includes a Resource Center, Welcome Center, Emergency Shelter, Safe Camp and space to serve for inclement weather needs.

The Resource Center is a day-service drop-in facility that includes on-site staff, partner agencies, basic hygiene services and services such as: meals, restrooms, showers, laundry, case management, computers and electronic device charging stations.

The Welcome Center is a space where staff are ready to meet individuals where they are on their journey to move into housing. Whether transitioning from the day-service drop-in Resource Center at Campus or seeking services for the first time, this space provides individuals with access to services including campus case management and behavioral health services.

The Emergency Shelter provides basic hygienic services including restrooms, handwashing, showers, and laundry to 549 individuals, admitting single adults in into beds.

Safe Camp serves as a space where staff provides access to basic services and an individual unit location for individuals not wishing to move into congregate shelters.

The Nevada Cares Campus also offers a warming center and cooling center during inclement weather. Staff follow local weather warnings, to include low and high temperatures, freezing rain, snow, high temperatures, warnings of heat stroke and dehydration due to weather conditions, or warnings to stay inside due to poor air quality.

In addition to inclement weather needs, winter Overflow Beds are also deployed beginning (on or about) December 1, where 84 winter overflow beds are available at the Nevada Cares Campus. If an unhoused individual arrives at the Nevada Cares Campus and there is no available bed in the emergency shelter, they will be able to stay the night in the winter overflow on a first come, first served basis. Each person will be provided a bed, linens, and a locker to secure personal items."

FISH Revitalization Project 101 E Adams Carson City

Friends In Service Helping or FISH, in Carson City, is a multi-faceted regional non-profit that trains medical students and nursing students from UNR, at the FISH medical clinic, and social workers from a number of colleges within their client services programs. FISH is also the acronym used by the organization to keep their mission in focus. FISH provides <u>Food, Instruction, Shelter, and Healthcare</u> to those in need, to help families become more self-sufficient. They have 7 shelters, 3 food banks, medical & dental services, utility assistance programs, showers, laundry and a student housing project to help revitalize the region.

The FISH Revitalization project's primary goal is to provide a supportive and stable living environment for individuals/families while the underemployed adults focus on technical training. This will take them from minimum wage to meaningful careers that provide healthcare and additional training/development opportunities. College-level technical training will be provided by partner organizations, like Western Nevada College, to meet the needs of regional employers (medical, IT, HVAC, manufacturing, long-haul trucking, etc.).

Once completed, FISH will provide not only housing but training for all members of the family so that they may have the necessary skills to move forward in society with renewed job opportunities. FISH and its partners will use various funding sources (HUD vouchers, Pell grants, etc.) to offset participant costs through graduation and initial employment. We will then work with the families to transition to other housing as they grow their financial resources. FISH is revitalizing Carson City's downtown, workforce, and, most importantly, families.

The Village at Sage

300 Sage St. Reno Nevada

The Village on Sage Street opened in August 2019 to provide stability through housing to low-income individuals as part of the "Community Foundation of Northern Nevada's" innovative solutions for housing in the Reno area and is operated by Volunteers of America. This unique facility is comprised of eight modular buildings with 216 small single-occupancy units for individuals that are at least 18 years of age. The Village is primarily designed to serve working people earning minimum wage, or those with other low income. The Village will provide a foundation and stability for its lodgers and contribute to the overall well-being of the entire community.

The private rooms come equipped with locking doors, operable window, desk, bed, closet, and flat screen tv. The Village also has onsite laundry, meeting and recreation spaces, is Wi-fi compatible, and provides an outdoor gathering area. The rental unit rate is \$555 per month with a \$555 required security deposit.
