

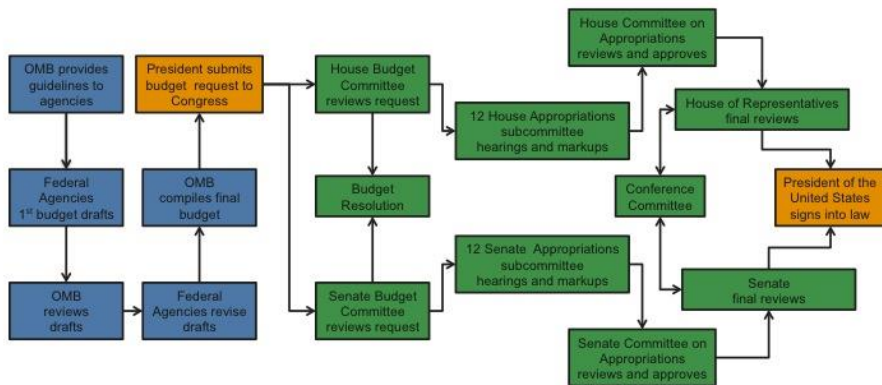

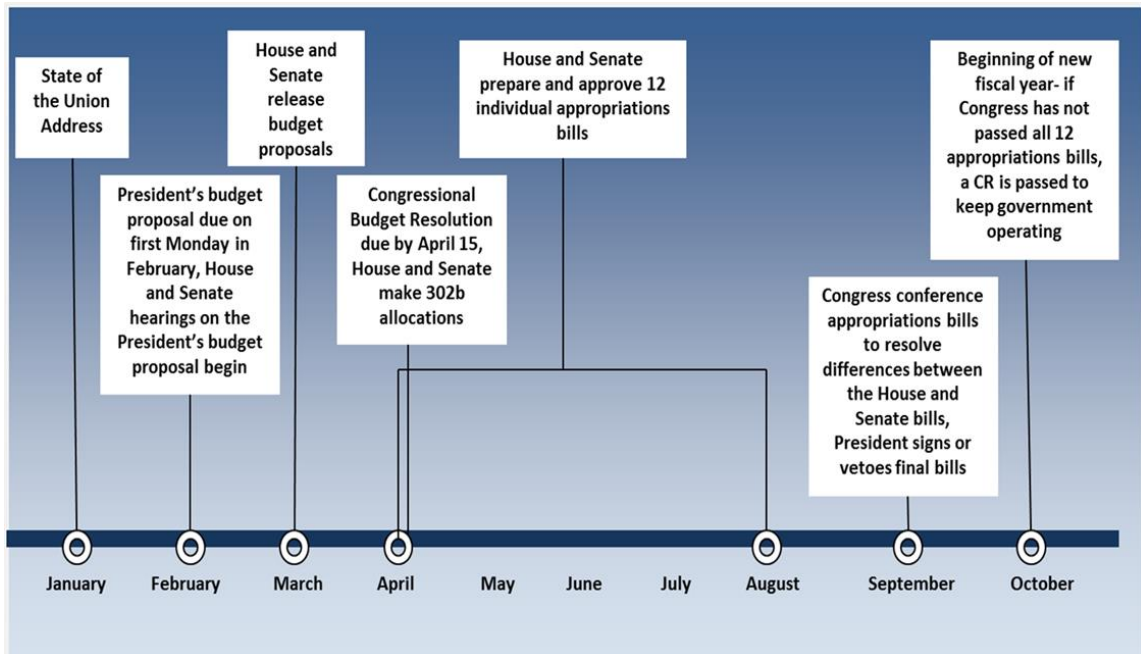

## FY 2026 Transportation- HUD Appropriations

- FY 2026 enacted on February 3, 2026
- 43-day government shutdown, 2-day shutdown
- President proposed elimination of most CPD programs
- House proposed elimination of HOME
- Senate proposed cuts to CDBG

## Community Development

Program	FY25 Enacted	FY26 President	FY26 Enacted
CDBG	\$3.3 billion	\$0	<b>\$3.3 billion</b>
PRO Grants	\$100 million	\$0	<b>\$50 million</b>
RHP Grants	\$30 million	\$0	<b>\$30 million</b>
EDI (“earmarks”)	\$0 ***	\$0	<b>\$3.62 billion</b>

\*\*\*There were no earmarks in FY25 because funding passed as a full-year continuing resolution.

- Section 108 loans would be capped at \$300 million for FY26, a decrease of \$100 million. Congress said the decrease is due to underuse of the program.

## Housing

Program	FY25 Enacted	FY26 President	FY26 Enacted
HOME	\$1.25 billion	\$0	<b>\$1.25 billion</b>

- Flat funding for HOME is a “win” for us, since both the President’s budget and the House proposed eliminating HOME funding in FY26.
  - The bill’s language also waives the 24-month commitment deadline for HOME, as they have done in recent years.
- **Housing Trust Fund:** The HTF is funded through the GSEs (Fannie Mae, Freddie Mac), not through annual appropriations.

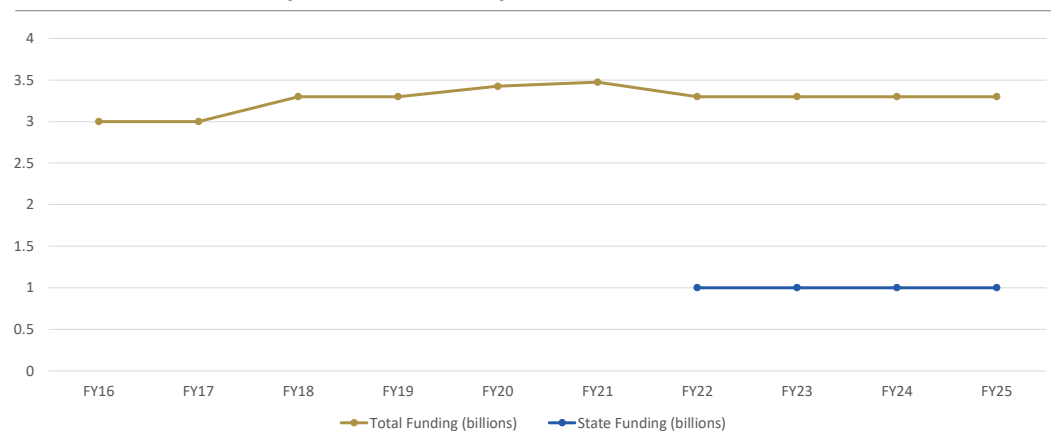
# Homelessness

Program	FY25 Enacted	FY26 President	FY26 Enacted
ESG	\$290 million	\$0	<b>\$290 million</b>
CoCs	\$3.54 billion	\$4.024 billion	<b>\$4.01 billion</b>
Homeless Data Analysis	\$10 million	\$0	<b>\$10 million</b>
Youth Homeless Demonstration	\$107 million	\$0	<b>\$107 million</b>

- **Emergency Housing Vouchers (EHVs)** – The bill allows HUD to use tenant protection vouchers (TPVs) for EHV households and provides waiver authorities to transition EHV households to the regular voucher program.
- **FY25 CoC NOFO** – The bill attempts to prevent widespread lapses in CoC grants due to HUD’s FY25 CoC NOFO process (more details on the next slide).

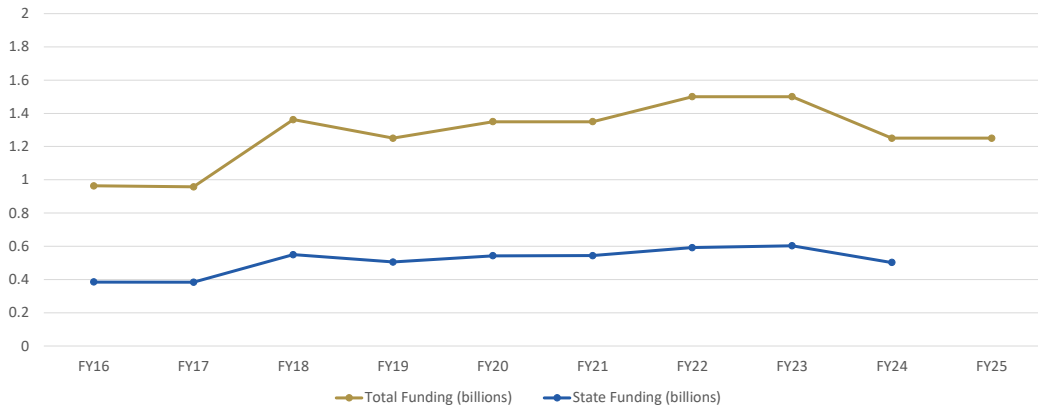

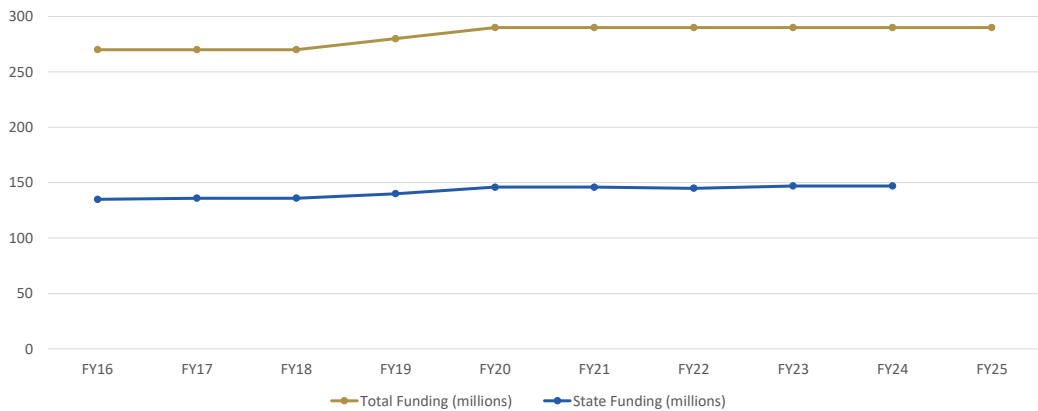
